AI for SMEs

The project

Artificial Intelligence is becoming increasingly prevalent across diverse spheres of the business and social life, given its ability to enhance the automation and prediction capacity of firms and organisations or to bring natural language processing and image recognition to a new level.

Applications are pervasive, embedded in software, devices or platforms, foreshadowing far-reaching consequences on the functioning and performance of firms, industries and places.

Small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) face greater disadvantages in the transformation. SMEs face barriers in adopting AI such as lack of awareness and readiness.

The AI BIZ project wants to support the implementation of AI in SMEs by providing educational materials and paths in order to help non expert workers and managers' understanding the AI potential for SMEs and how to access and implement AI based tools. AI BIZ- Exploiting Artificial Intelligence Technologies for SMEs is an Erasmus+ small scale partnerships in vocational education and training sector aiming at supporting SMEs to access and use AI tool in their daily activities.

In this newsletter, you will find the project information in a nutshell and a description of the activities carried out so far.

Target groups

The project target group includes entrepreneurs and managers working in SMEs, in particular, those that have started a digital transition process and want to take advantage of the latest development of digital technologies. The project is not addressed to IT developers or technicians, but wants to enable workers and managers, even with basic digital skills, to understand the potential of AI for SMEs, access AI tools and properly use them during their daily practices.



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Project results

1. Al BIZ Toolkit

The first result consists of supporting materials and tools to help SMEs properly access and use AI

2. AI BIZ Workshops

The second result consists of training activities aiming at supporting SMEs in improving their knowledge, skills, and competencies on how to exploit the potential of AI in their contexts.

3. AI BIZ Launch Conference

The third result consists of a face-to-face conference organised in each partner country to promote the project results and raising awareness about the benefits and risks of using AI for SMEs.

Activities carried out

AI BIZ kick off meeting
